Our gala, "Wrangling Hope: A Gala for the Voiceless," was a resounding success with 500 attendees. Madison Lechti's powerful story captivated everyone as she shared her journey from receiving services at Life Stories to interning with us, then graduating with degrees in criminology, criminal justice and psychology and earning acceptance to a Master's program at DU. Madison exemplifies what's possible when children are heard, believed, receive trauma-informed care and families are offered proper support. In Madison's words, "[children] are able to not just survive, but thrive."

Continuing our mission of support and healing, this quarter also marks a significant transition in our Child Advocacy Center leadership. We've welcomed two exceptional professionals to our team as we bid a fond farewell to our beloved administrator Chris Eisenhower upon her retirement. 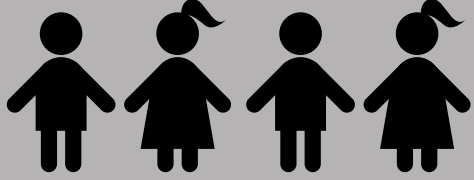
